

TOWN HALL MASTER PLAN

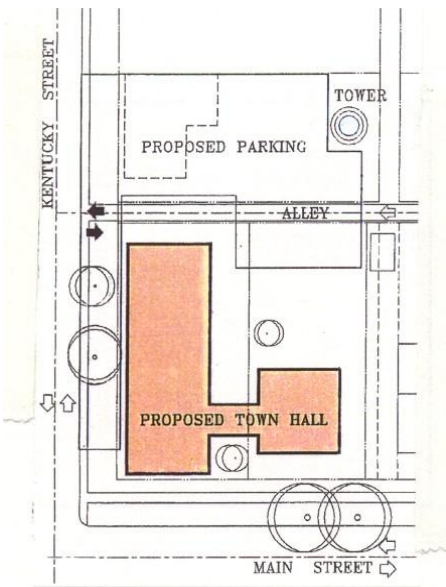

A town-owned and vacant double lot in the Main Street Historic District was the site for the Study for the New Government Center.

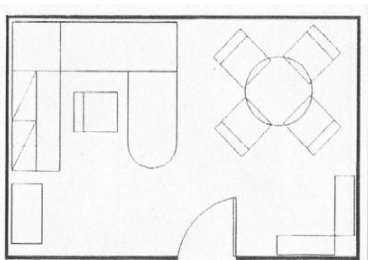
Our feasibility study, performed while a project manager with another Architectural Firm, tried to put forth the image of two distinct forms joined by a glass bridge. The form to the left was the main administrative area and mimicked the former home with its wrap-around porch. The arts and craft image derives from several homes found in the district. The form to the right was envisioned to be the large meeting hall and miscellaneous offices. The meeting hall was not as deep in plan allowing for a rear courtyard and accessible parking.

The projected cost for this project was determined in 1994 to be \$1,500,000.
